OUR LADY OF IPSWICH

(The picture shows our new statue immediately before it was shipped to the UK.)

In mediæval Ipswich there was a great devotion to Our Lady of Ipswich. The original shrine was on Lady Lane in the centre of town.

At the time of the Reformation in England under Henry VIII many shrines to Our Lady were destroyed and the statues were taken to London by Thomas Cromwell's men to be burnt.

The story is that the statue of Our Lady of Ipswich was rescued and shipped abroad to safety in a town called Nettuno on the north west coast of Italy. (The same town, as it happens, where St Maria Goretti was born many years later.) Today, there is still a statue of Our Lady in Nettuno. It has been there for over 500 years and has always been known as the English Lady. In addition, chemical tests have shown that the wood of the statue contains a higher salt content that would



normally be expected unless the statue had spent some time at sea. Taken together, these details, along with a few others, give us a very high degree of certainty that the statue in Nettuno is indeed the original mediæval statue from Ipswich.

In 1977, the Guild of Our Lady of Ipswich—founded on a joint initiative of parishioners from St Pancras (including the late Maire 'Doc' Heley and Judy Fell) and parishioners from St Mary at the Elms Anglican church—was set up with the twin aims of praying for Christian unity and re-establishing the shrine of Our Lady of Grace of Ipswich. A statue was carved by a St Pancras parishioner, Robert Mellamphy, and a pilgrim walk from near Wolsey's Gate to Lady Lane was begun. The walk has continued annually on the Sunday closest to Our Lady's birthday, 8th September, ever since.

A year ago St Pancras parish commissioned a specialist woodwork shop in northern Italy, Stuflessers, to produce a hand-carved replica in Linden wood of the statue in Nettuno, identical, as far as possible, in size and colour, style and design. A couple of days ago, the statue arrived. It has been paid for by three anonymous donors who each gave a substantial gift to cover the entire cost of production and transport. To them we owe a huge debt of gratitude.

Now, with a replica of the statue arrived at St Pancras, there is once more, and for the first time since the Reformation, a statue of Our Lady of Ipswich in a Catholic church in the town. She is also known as Our Lady of Grace, and our new bishop, Bishop Peter Collins, has already agreed to come and bless the statue on the feast of Our Lady of Grace (15th May) next year. However, before then we have a Mass of welcome at 12:15pm on Thursday 13th July when we will be joined by other priests from around Ipswich.


