ST MARTHA — f.d. 29th July

Tradition tells us that, after the first persecutions of Christians, Saint Martha, with her sister Mary Magdalene, and her brother Lazarus, along with other disciples, left their own land and went to France, arriving in Saintes-Maries-de-la-Mer, in Provence, where they brought the Christian faith. The liturgical memorial of Saint Martha was begun by Franciscans, in 1262, who celebrated her feast on 29 July, eight days after the feast of her sister, St Mary Magdalene. In Bethany (now known as El-Azariyeh, "the place of Lazarus"), one can find the tomb of Lazarus, as well as a sanctuary built upon the remains of Byzantine and Crusader structures, themselves constructed on top of a pre-existing structure. This

is believed to be the house of Martha. The church, with its sanctuary in the form of a Greek -cross, is embellished with beautiful mosaics, that portray the episodes related in the Gospel that refer to Martha, Mary, and Lazarus.

Fr Joseph writes: We resume our consideration of the Creed with a reflection on Christ's everlasting kingdom.

AND HIS KINGDOM WILL HAVE NO END

As we have seen, God dwells in an eternal present with no past and no future. Following the second coming of Our Lord at the end of the world as we know it, there will be no more time because time itself is part of the created order which will have been consummated in the new creation. Eternity for us will not consist of a future which stretches out infinitely beyond the horizon, nor will it involve a series of repetitions, or even a stasis, extending further than the eye can see or the mind imagine, threatening an overwhelming monotony. Rather, we will participate in God's eternal present, and join with Him in a life of perfect blessedness which, in its richness and its satisfying of mind, body, and soul, will exceed our wildest imaginings.

It is this Kingdom which will have no end, a Kingdom over which God holds

sway as its Creator and Redeemer (Rom 5:21), a Kingdom consisting of all that has been re-created in the order of grace (Rev 21:1), of all those who have had their robes washed white in the blood of the Lamb (Rev 7:14; 22:14), of all those ranks of angels who remained faithful to their Maker in the face of Lucifer's cosmic rebellion (Rev 12:7-9). In short, it will be a Kingdom inaugurated by Our Lord at the moment of His Incarnation, throughout all the moments of His life, death, resurrection, and ascension into Heaven; a Kingdom which now comprises all that Our Lord has drawn to Himself in being raised up, on the Cross, in His resurrection, and in His ascension (Jn 12:32).

In truth, those in a state of grace already participate in this eternal present even whilst still living here on earth, for the Kingdom of God is not only at hand with the coming of the Son of God (Mk 1:15) but is already within those who have been baptized (Lk 17:21; Jn 1:12; Jn 3:3-5). To have received sanctifying grace in baptism, and not to have lost it again through sin, or to have had it restored once more through the Sacrament of Confession, is to have the Kingdom of God within us, and to participate already in God's eternal present. To this extent a person may be said already to have one foot in heaven, for to be in a state of grace on earth or in a state of glory in Heaven is to participate in one and the same thing, namely the life of God.

Even so, there remains a tension, and we still pray every day, 'Thy Kingdom come,' because whilst God's kingdom is indeed established here on earth, it is not yet unqualified, either within any given individual or within society as a whole. Like wheat and weeds growing together in the same field (Mt 13:24-30), sin and death remain as authorities and powers whose conquest has been accomplished but which conquest is yet to be completed and perfected.
