


CAROLS BY CANDLELIGHT & BLESSING OF CRIBS

During the Christmas Octave (Tuesday 26th – Saturday 30th)

Tuesday – Friday: 30 minutes before each weekday Mass Saturday: 9:30 – 10am & 5pm – 5:45pm Advent always begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, so sometimes, like this year when Christmas Day falls on a Monday, Advent is only three weeks and one day long!

Christmas Day has an Octave, which means that each of the eight days from Christmas Day to New Year's Day (inclusive) are all part of one long, extended Christmas Day! During this Octave we also celebrate the feasts of:

St Stephen, the first Martyr, on 26th December
St John, the Evangelist, on 27th December
The Holy Innocents, slaughtered by King Herod, on 28th December
St Thomas à Becket, martyred by King Henry II, on 29th December
The Holy Family on the Sunday within the Octave
(this year, on Sunday 31st December)
The Holy Mother of God on the Octave Day, 1st January


But the season of Christmastide is much longer, and comes in two phases. The first phase begins on Christmas Day and lasts up till the evening before the feast of the Epiphany. Then, the second phase of Christmastide – called Epiphanytide – lasts all the way up to the Feast of Candlemas on 2nd February when Our Lord is presented in the Temple in Jerusalem by Our Lady and St Joseph.

The Feast of Candlemas — when we all carry candles in a solemn procession around the church at Mass — is, then, the end of the Church's season of light which began when Christ, who is Light Itself, was born! Whilst Christmas trees and other decorations come down after the feast of the Epiphany, many families keep their Crib up until Candlemas.
