#### **PASSIONTIDE**

A mini season in its own right, it covers the last two weeks of Lent and is older in its observance than Lent itself. Passiontide is an echo of the two weeks of preparation observed by the People of Israel in the run-up to the sacrifice of the Passover Lamb when, 'On the fourteenth day of the first month, towards evening, will be the Passover of the Lord' (Ex 12:6; Lev 23:5). Highly coloured statues are covered (almost as if the saints themselves cannot bear to look on what is just about to happen to the Son of God) and a more sombre air descends on the church. Even crucifixes are veiled, reminding us that in the last few days of His public ministry—and so that the Pharisees could not arrest Him until His hour had come—Our Lord 'hid Himself, and went out of the temple' (Jn 8:59). At Christmas, in the stable in Bethlehem, the glorious divinity of the Son of God is hid from our eyes. Now, on the Cross, Our Lord appears as one 'marred... beyond human semblance' so severely wounded is He (Is 52:14). It is as if even His humanity is now hid from our eyes.

**CONFESSION** We now enter the season richest in graces. Do not waste this time. Renew your Lenten resolutions of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, whether you've managed to keep them thus far or not. And if you have not yet been to Confession this Lent, get to Confession now, before Easter.

Confessions in Portuguese Fr Erico from the parish in Downham Market will be at St Pancras to hear confessions on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> March, 6pm—7pm.

**Fr Joseph writes:** We continue to look at the first of the Sacraments, Baptism.

### THE SACRAMENTS PT 10 BAPTISM – INSTITUTED BY CHRIST

All seven sacraments were instituted by Christ whilst He was personally present here on earth two thousand years ago. It is not absolutely certain when He instituted the Sacrament of Baptism but it is generally accepted that it was instituted at the moment of His own Baptism in the River Jordan (Mt 3:13-17; Mk 1:9-11; Lk 3:21-22).

The Son of God did not need to be baptized. He was not tainted by the stain of original sin nor had He committed any actual sins. Being God, He did not need the Sacrament of Baptism in order to be initiated into the life of God. Being the Only-Begotten Son of God, He did not need to be reconciled to His Father. Being already filled with the Holy Spirit, He did not need to be infused with the breath of the Holy Spirit, that is, sanctifying grace. Even so, He was not baptized merely to set us a good example. Nothing Our Lord said or did was purely for the sake of setting us an example. Every word and action of the Incarnate Son of God actually accomplished one or other aspect of our salvation.

Several things happened all at once when Our Lord went down into the waters of the Jordan to be baptized in His humanity. He was both anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah in His humanity and was revealed to the onlookers to be the Messiah. He was revealed to be the Son of God by the words spoken by His Father, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased' (Mt 3:17). For the first time, God was revealed to be Triune with all three Persons of the Blessed Trinity being made known: the Father in the words He spoke, the Son coming up out of the waters, and the Holy Spirit who, in the form of a dove, descended upon the Son. He continued His emptying of Himself of all the appearances of divine splendour (Phil 2:7) by humbling Himself and agreeing to be baptized by a mere creature. Indeed, His cousin, John the Baptist, protested that it was Christ who should be baptizing John (Mt 3:14-15) because he, St John, was not fit even to carry His sandals (Mt 3:11).

At the moment of His baptism, Our Lord was also inaugurating a new age, ushering in a new reality, the era of salvation. Whilst the birth of the Church is usually understood to have taken place at Pentecost when the Holy Spirit was sent by the Son (now ascended back into heaven) down upon the Apostles (Acts 2:1-4), nonetheless there are several moments which could be thought of as being instrumental in bringing the Church to birth. Our Lord's nativity in the stable in Bethlehem is one such. His Baptism in the Jordan is another. From this moment on, the world would never be the same again.

Finally, with His own Baptism, Our Lord instituted the Sacrament of Baptism for His disciples, even though its necessity for salvation did not become apparent until later.
