

# The Holy Spirit pt VI: The Effects of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles

There were four chief effects on the Apostles at Pentecost when the Holy Spirit first came down upon them, and although these effects were unique to the Apostles at the time nonetheless the coming down of the Holy Spirit upon us each Pentecost, and in the Sacrament of Confirmation, should have related effects.

The first of these four effects on the Apostles was to confirm them in their faith. Until this point, the Apostles had been weak and timid. They had run away from Christ in the Garden of Gethsemane. None, except St John, was present at the foot of the Cross, and even after the resurrection they still hid in the Upper Room for fear of the Jews. With the coming of the Holy Spirit they were filled with strength and courage, and with a faith that burned within them, just as the hearts of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus burned with faith (Lk 24:32). The effects of the Holy Spirit on us should be similar: our hearts should burn with a passionate faith in—and with a passionate zeal for—all that God has revealed to us in the Catholic Faith.

The second effect of the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles was to sanctify them. God draws us to himself by the working of His actual grace, a sort of pulling movement on our souls. But with the coming of the Holy Spirit and the beginning of the Sacraments, God poured sanctifying grace into the souls of His Apostles to forgive them their sins and make them holy, to make them more like to Christ, to make them 'partakers of the divine nature' (2 Peter 1:4). Likewise, when we receive sanctifying grace in the Sacraments we, too, are forgiven our sins and made to be holy, made to be more like to Christ, made to be sharers in the divine nature.

The third effect was to enable them *to found the Church*. Having been sanctified, they were to sanctify others through the sacraments, but they were also enabled to found the Church through which they would preach and teach ('The Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, He will teach you all things,' Jn 14:26), and by which they would guide and rule ('Take heed to yourselves, and to all the flock over which the Holy Spirit has placed you, to rule the Church of God, which He has purchased with His own Blood,' Acts 20:28). All Catholics, especially those who have been Confirmed, are called to share in this evangelizing mission of Christ's holy Church and share the Catholic faith with others.

And finally, the fourth effect was on *the Apostles'* preaching. On the day of Pentecost alone, after St Peter preached, three thousand people were baptized, and following another sermon soon afterwards, a further five thousand (Acts 2:41 and 4:4). Such is the fire of faith bestowed by the Holy Spirit (and this explains why the Holy Spirit came down in *tongues* of fire: to symbolize not just the Word of God Himself but also to give zeal to the tongues of preachers). We, too, are called by God to pass on to others what we ourselves have received through the teachings and the sacraments of the holy Catholic Church that Christ Himself founded.
